



LOCAL RESIDENT INFORMATION – June 2017

Bucklesham Road & Park Lane, Kirton

Dear Resident,

I am writing to you on behalf of Iberdrola Engineering and Construction, who will be operating as Principle Contractor for the East Anglia ONI onshore cable route installation.

The onshore cable route associated with the project is approximately 36.7km in length and is located predominantly on farmland with some crossings of public highways, footpaths and bridleways. The route runs from the proposed new substation location off Bullen Lane, Bramford, Ipswich, and circumnavigates Ipswich to the north and east to its end position, known as the landfill, at the beach front of Ferry Road.

To enable the construction phase to proceed with minimal disruption to all local residents and road users there are areas along the route requiring road alterations and improvements and this is programmed to take place from January to July 2017.

Park Lane/Bucklesham Road Junction

23.05.17 Installation of signs with the use of 3 way traffic lights.

Park Lane

08.06.17 to 20.06.17 Installation of 3 passing places with the use of TO15 temporary road closure. The works will be undertaken in 2 phases to allow access at all times.

The works will be undertaken with 2 types of traffic management:

1. 3 way traffic signals
2. TO15 temporary road closure – allowing traffic to be held for up to 15 minutes at any one time. Through access is still permitted but could lead to short term delay.

Can I ask that all road users take notice of the temporary work signs that will be placed in advance of the works, reduce travel speed leading up to the works and follow all directory signage in place.

The work will be undertaken by IEC's main contractor Roadbridge with traffic management installed by local company Palmer Group.

I appreciate that whilst we undertake these works, they are likely to cause you some inconvenience, but please be assured that we will endeavour to keep disruption to a minimum and that the works will be completed as quickly as possible. We will be using traffic management to maintain safety and to manage the flow of traffic as efficiently as possible during the works, in compliance with current regulations and in consultation with the Local Authority.

I would like to take this opportunity to request that you follow all traffic management guidance systems to ensure the safety of the general public and the workforce and to alleviate any unnecessary delays and disruption and to thank you in advance for your co-operation in this matter.
